



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor dated the 28<sup>th</sup> of December Anno Dom. 1736. The above described Tract of Land was surveyed unto Samuel Wollaston in the Township of Tulpehoccon. Beginning at a Hickery by Tulpehoccon Creek Thence North 10 degrees West by Vacant Land or the Improvement of Benjamin Cowpland 288 perches to a White Oak Thence West by Vacant Land 144 perches to a Small Hickery. Thence South 10 degrees East by the Improvement of — Hudson 173 perches to a Small Elm by the said Creek. Thence down the same on the several Courses thereof 308 perches to y<sup>e</sup> place of Beginning. Containing Two hundred and sixteen acres beside y<sup>e</sup> allowance of six per Cent for roads
