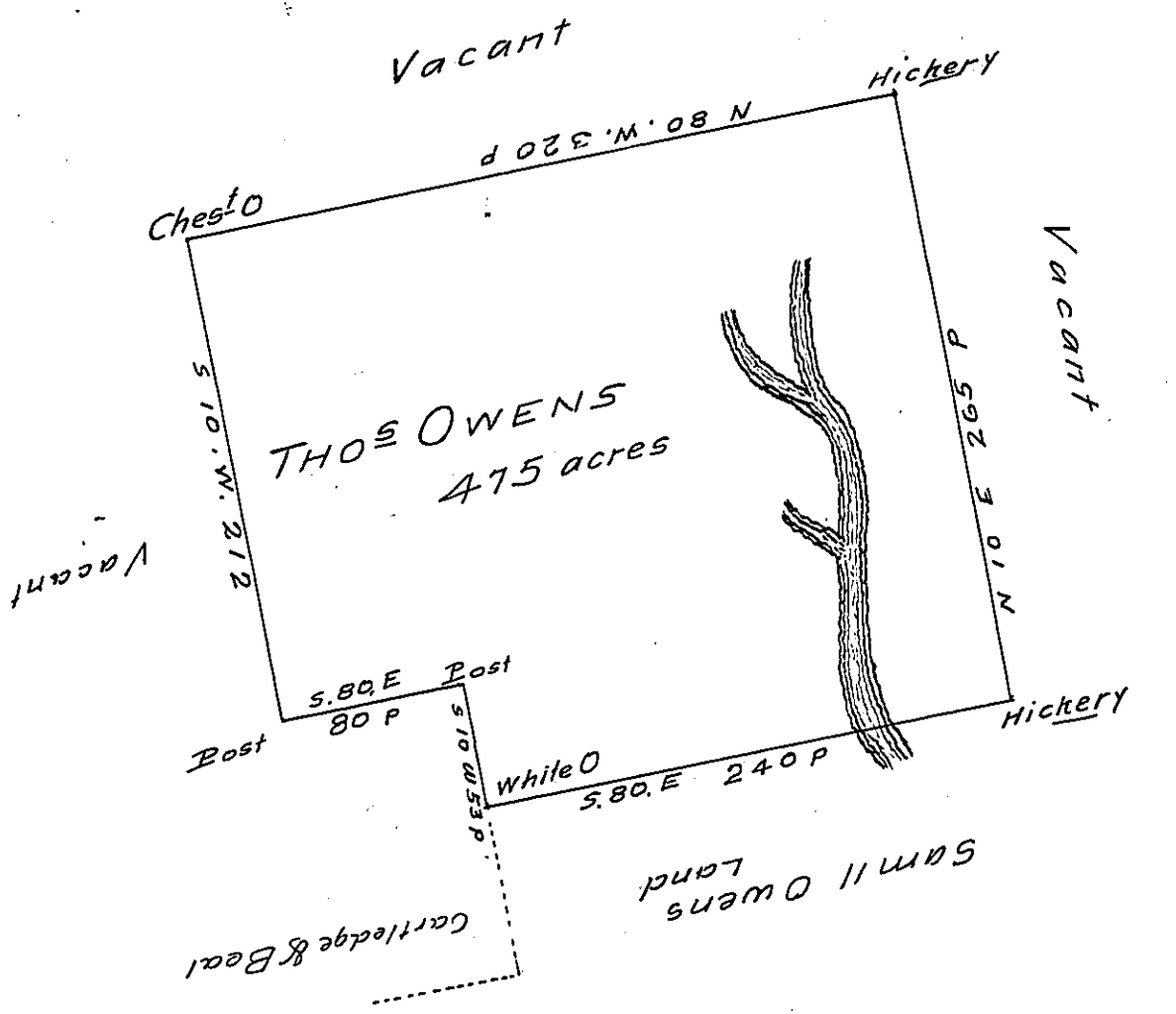

By virtue of a Warrant from the Honble proprietaries bearing date the _____ day of _____ Anno Dom. _____ I have surveyed unto Thomas Owen in the Township of Hopewell in the County of Lancaster on the West side River. Four hundred and seventy five acres with allowance of Six p^{Beginning} Cent^{at a White oak} a corner of Sam^{ll} Owens land. Thence South Eighty degrees Easterly Two hundred and forty pches to a Hickery. Thence North Ten degrees Easterly Two hundred and Sixty five pches to a Hickery. Thence North Eighty degrees Westerly Three hundred and Twenty pches to a Chesnut Oak. Thence South Ten degrees Westerly Two hundred and twelve pches to a post. Thence South Eighty degrees Easterly Eighty pches to a post. Thence South Ten degrees Westerly Fifty three pches to the place of Beginning. Survey'd Nov: 22^d/1736
