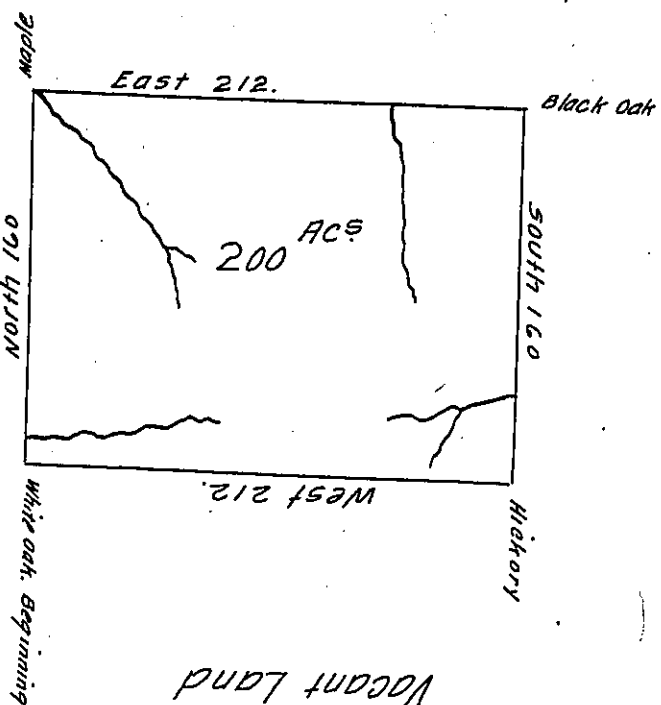

Vacant Land

The above is a Draught of a Survey made November the 16<sup>th</sup> 1793. in pursu-  
 ance of a Warrant Granted to the Trustees of Washington Academy for  
 3,000 Acres of Land in Separate Tracts, Dated the 9<sup>th</sup> of August 1793  
 Situate North West ward of the Rivers Ohio and Allegheny on the  
 Waters of Cannequenesing Creek in District N<sup>o</sup> 10. Called <sup>"Athens"</sup> ~~Woods~~ Camp  
 ing place. (Adjoining a Tract of Land Survey'd for Said Trustees Called  
 Morisons hunting Grounds) Containing Two hundred Acres of Land  
 together with Usual Allowance of Six p<sup>ct</sup> Cent for Roads.
