



Situate in the Barrens about half a Mile West of the head of Spruce Creek in Franklin Township and County of Huntingdon- Containing one hundred and thirty two Acres and twelve perches and the usual allowance of six Cent for Roads &c. Originally Surveyed The 30th day August 1784. In pursuance of a Warrant dated the 2^d day of August 1784- Resurveyed & corrected the 2^d day of June 1796.

Note. the land contained in the Black lines 132^{as} 12^{ps} Shews that taken in by the original Survey as the lines were Run & marked on the ground. the letter A is a part of the Survey as first made that was left out by M^c Woods when he made the Return. The Letter B is a Part of Joseph Morgan Junr's Tract that has by Mistake been taken into Isaac Worrells Survey. the Letter C. was also added to the first Survey as Run and marked on the ground as aforesaid and returned by Mistake. The above reasons are Submitted to the Surveyor General in order that the Survey 132^{as} 12^{ps} as aforesaid may be accepted & That the Erroneous return Interfering with Joseph Morgan Junr's Survey made on his prior Warrant & Including land not taken in or intended to be taken into Isaac Worrells Survey may be withdrawn.
