



Situate on the head branches of Stony Creek, now in Stony Creek Township Somerset County (late Bedford) -- The whole tract 221<sup>a</sup> 314 & all, appears to have been surveyed in the year 1774 for Jacob Smith in pursuance of a Warrant granted to him for 150<sup>a</sup>; by Alexander McClean, Esq<sup>r</sup> then Deputy Surveyor, of that part of Bedford County; which appears by his Record thereof in this Office. I have cut off the 110<sup>a</sup> 100<sup>ps</sup> & allowance at the request of Christian Stoner who purchased so much from Jacob Smith & who prays a patent therefor by virtue of an agreement duly proved in Court, since the decease of said Smith - done & Certified this 1<sup>st</sup> December, 1817.
