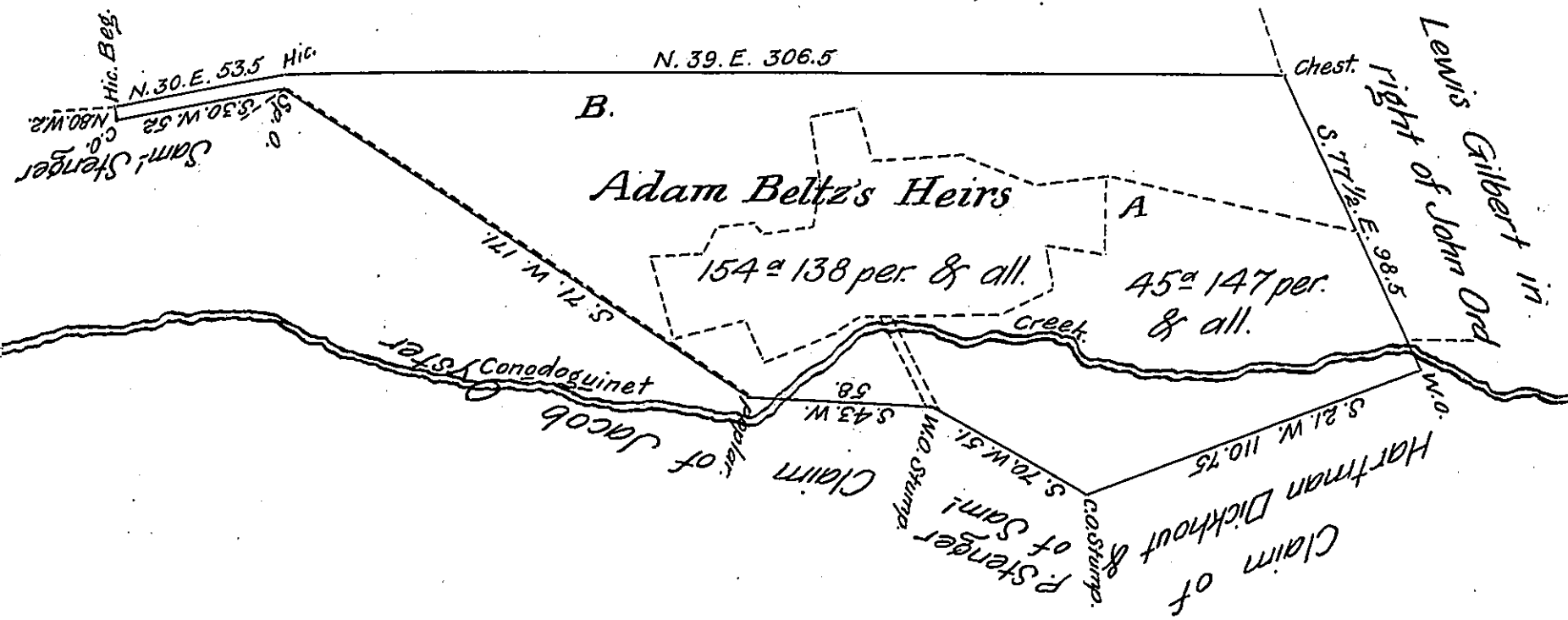


Gen<sup>l</sup> James Chambers's Heirs in right of W<sup>m</sup> Linn



A Draught of a tract of Land situate in St Thomas or Letterkenny Townships Contairing 154 Acres 138 perches & allowance Surveyed December 15<sup>th</sup> 1841 for Adam Beltz's Heirs in pursuance of a Warrant granted W<sup>m</sup> Stenger & James M<sup>c</sup>Calmont dated Aug<sup>st</sup> 25<sup>th</sup> 1886 p<sup>s</sup> Hugh Auld D.S.

N.B. The part A was surveyed to Sam<sup>l</sup> Stenger on Warrant dated Sept<sup>r</sup> 27<sup>th</sup> 1841 and contains 45 a 147 perches & allowance, the part B contains 92 a. — per. & allowance being part of a survey made for Sam<sup>l</sup> Stenger on Warrant dated Aug<sup>st</sup> 19<sup>th</sup> 1841; the Course bearing S. 71. W. 171 per. to a Spanish oak interferes with Jacob Oyster but in consequence of a survey being found in the name of Stenger & M<sup>c</sup>Calmont which was made Nov<sup>br</sup> 24<sup>th</sup> 1789 and marked trees found to corroborate with the survey. Begining at a Chestnut and following the courses 77 1/2 E. on to the Chestnut oak at the end of line S. 30. W. 52 perches I found several old marked trees which I had block<sup>d</sup> and proved to be 52 years and other marks 19 or 20 years and said Heirs claims on right of Stenger & M<sup>c</sup>Calmont being in possession 47 years.
