



The above tract is situate in Saltlick township Fayette County was surveyed by Richard William Colvin (my predecessor in office) in December 1838 in pursuance of a Warrant granted Thomas Small Junior for 400 acres, dated the 4th day of February 1794 on which there is two improvements, each about 25 acres, two houses occupied as dwellings two stables and some other necessary buildings, appears to have been improved about 9 years. Bowders & Hofances families are residing thereon. I have in accordance with the request of Mr Daniel Small (your clerk) examined the survey sent me by him and found some inaccuracies which I have corrected above. I send inclosed the survey red of Mr Small that you may compare the two together. The files in this office show two warrants one in the name of Andrew Douglas and one in the name of Richard Howard which may both have been executed on the same ground, at A, for all that I know, as I find it has been frequently done in that township.
