



Situate in Chanceford township York County & containing as above set forth 60<sup>as</sup> 136<sup>ps</sup> and allowance of land. Originally surveyed by William Matthews late D.S on the 29<sup>th</sup> of the 11<sup>th</sup> Mo. 1768. In pursuance of a warrant bearing date the 2<sup>nd</sup> of August 1762 granted to Nicholas Strayer for 100<sup>as</sup>. Resurveyed on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of May 1811. And now at the request of the heirs of John Musser deceased, who are the present owners, it is returned for confirmation the 29<sup>th</sup> day of May Anno Domini 1811.
