



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Sixth day of November 1734 Surveyed unto Martin Ter a tract of Land situate in — New Cowisschoppin adjoining to his other Land in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup> Beginning at a post a corner of his other Land thence by y<sup>e</sup> same South West one hundred and sixteen perches to a post thence by Vacant land North West thirty seven perches to a post thence by Vacant land North East one hundred and sixteen perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South East thirty seven perches to the place of Beginning Containing twenty five acres with the usual allowance of six & Cent.
