



In Pursuance of an Order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of June 1772 a Survey was made on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of July 1772 for John — Scannell on a Certain Lot of ground in the Town of Sunbury in the County of Northumberland marked in a general Plan of said Town Number Three Hundred & Eighteen. Containing in breadth East and West on Hurtleberry and in length North and South Two hundred and Thirty feet. Street Sixty feet, Bounded Northward by Hurtleberry street aforesaid, Eastward by Lot Number Three Hundred & Seventeen, Southward by Billberry Alley, and Westward by Lot Number Three Hundred and Nineteen. Returned into the Secretary's office the 8<sup>th</sup> day of September 1774 for Michael Troy Esq<sup>r</sup> by Warrant dated the 7<sup>th</sup> Instant.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February 1833, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twenty eighth day of February 1907.
