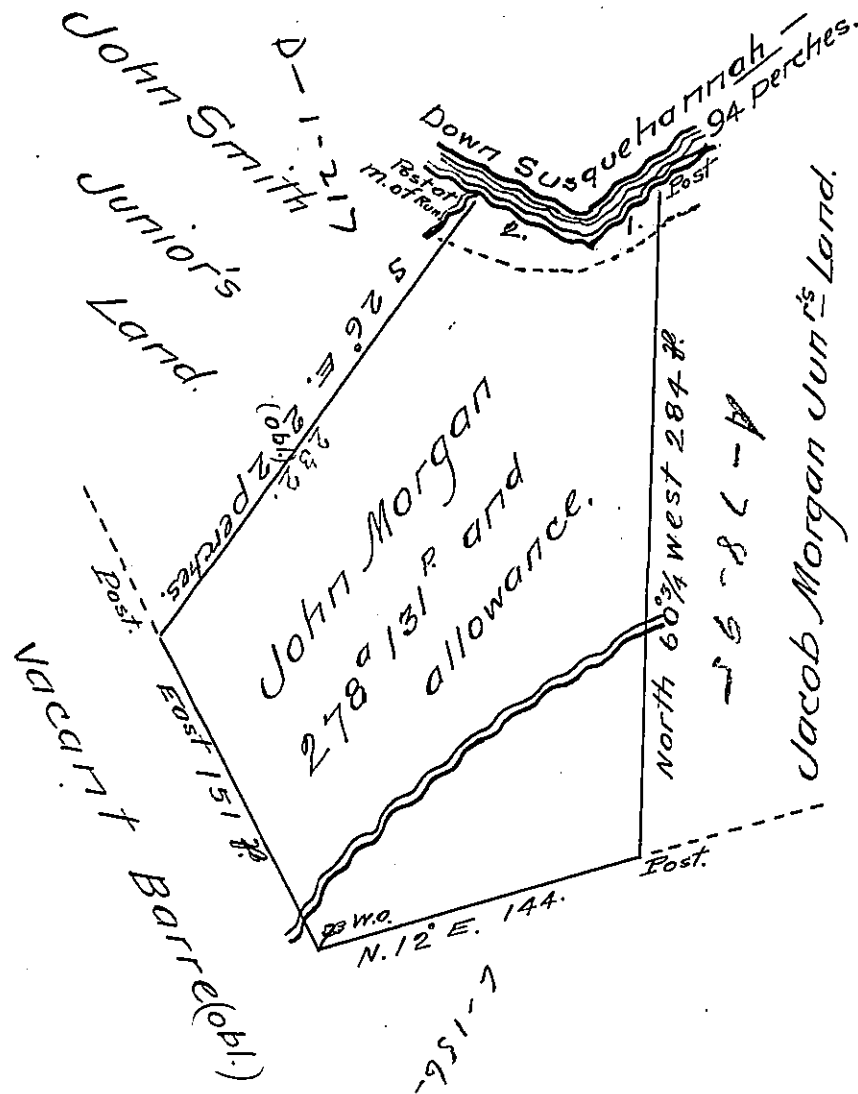

The above is the Draught of a Tract of Land, formerly called, and hereafter to be known, by the Name of Chingleclamouche, adjoining and above the old Town of that Name Surveyed for Jacob Morgan Junr. and adjoining and below Land of John Smith Junr. on the South Side of the West branch of Susquehanna River; about Two Miles above the Mouth of Clearfield Creek in Cumberland County. Containing Two Hundred and Seventy Eight Acres, and One Hundred and Thirty one Perches and the usual allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent. for Roads. Surveyed the 11th Day of July 1769 for John Morgan, in Pursuance of an Order N^o 1283 Dated April 3^d 1769.
