Note - The improvements on the above consist of 2 Dwelling Houses, one log stable & a Saw Mill, with about 70<sup>ac</sup> cleared land, first improved in March 1802. - The part marked A on the Western portion of the above draft indicated by dotted lines, from 45 to 50<sup>ac</sup> is claimed by virtue of Elizabeth Duffield's survey, but is embraced within William's improvement lines of 1802 - so says A.M. Elder who made the above Survey for me.
