



By Virtue of a Warr^t from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing date the Twenty fifth of March Anno Dom: 1738. I have surveyed and laid out unto James Young in the Township of Pennsborough in the County of Lancaster on the West side Susquehanna River One hundred and seventy one acres of Land with allowance of 6 p Cent. Beginning at a Red Oak a corner of John Youngs land in the line of Robert Gilkisons land Thence South nine degrees Westerly Fifty four perches to a White Oak Thence South Twenty degrees Easterly Seventy eight perches to a Hickery Thence South Thirty degrees Easterly Twenty five perches to a heap of Stones Thence East One hundred Sixty nine perches to a White Oak Thence North One hundred and Forty eight perches to a post another corner John Youngs land Thence West One hundred Ninety nine perches and Three quarters to the place of Beginning. Survey'd May the 13th / 1738
