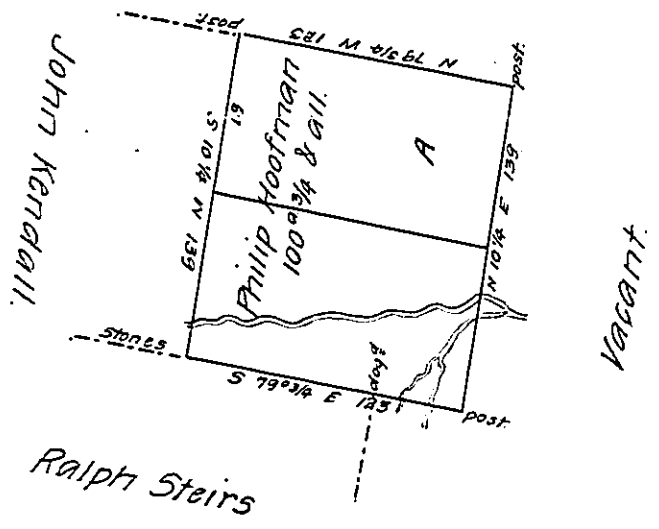


James Wells Junr & Richd Brown



Situate on Pound Lick Run in Milford township Somerset, formerly Bedford County and surveyed the 12th day of March 1796 in pursuance of a warrant dated the 24th day of October 1787.

To Daniel Brodhead Esquire P-Alexander Mclean

Note, that part marked A of the above survey is Caveated by John Wells alledging he has a patent for the same, and that the description of the above recited warrant will apply to other land adjacent, yet Vacant &c. On the other hand it is alledged that through mistake an original warrant was brought forward shortly after the above date, but having been discovered before it was put into the hands of the deputy it was sent back and a copy procured which copy was not delivered to the Deputy until the 16th day of July 1795. as appears by the Endorsement, as certified by the Assistant to me. It is alledged also that Mr. Wells had been informed that such a warrant had been taken out previous to his surveying the land on the right of Wells & Brown (but the warrant was not shewn) that he afterwards persisted in making the survey and procured the patent. It is further alledged that there is no land adjacent to the above, to which the warrant would apply that is of value, or in any degree worth patenting except a piece or tract nearly adjacent which the said John Wells has taken a warrant for, of later date, than the above, and as it is alledged that the land circumscribed by the above survey, contains the intention of the party he does not think fit to remove it or yield to any other.
