



A Draught of a Tract of Land called Hickory Level situate about obl mile southward of the West Branch of Susquehanna<sup>r</sup> River at the head of a smobl Run which empties into the said River about fourteen miles below the Mouth of the Chest Creek about fifteen miles above Chingleclamouche old Town including some of the heads of the waters of Clearfield Creek in the County of Bedford containing three hundred and twenty three acres and the usual allowance of six P. Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed the 29th day of June 1773 for Richard Whitehead in pursuance of a warrant granted to him dated the 12th day of May in the same year. by
