


FORM NO. 1.



Draft of a tract of land situate in the certified Township of Wilkes Barre one of the certified seventeen Townships, containing thirty five acres and six perches and the usual allowance of six percent for Roads &c. being part of a larger survey made to said Nathan Waller in pursuance of an act of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, passed the 4th day of April 1799 and which survey and certificate thereunto annexed is dated November 10th 1803, and the said draft <sup>afse</sup> containing the whole of Lot No. 15, in the first devission of Lots in said Township, and also part of Lot No. 14 in said Devission, the same being in the County of Luzerne. Resurveyed April 2d 1824.
