



A Draught of a survey executed August 7th 1825 in pursuance of an order from the Board of Property dated April 30th 1823* to Resurvey a tract of land on the Chartier Creek, Patented in the name of Edward Price, and now owned by John Wilson containing as per resurvey two hundred and sixty nine acres, three Rods & allow^s of six pr^e for roads &c. Note the line adjoining Mary-Barclay (Location No 1625) is laid down in the original Survey at 52° which is evidently a mistake; when run at 32° it gives the distance on the Creek, and also corresponds with the shape or meanderings of the Creek, beside by blocking the trees on the lines I find the line at 32° will Count 16 or 17 years more than the one at 52° I have excluded Findlay's claim, and have not noted an interference of MSCOY because, from the best information I could obtain, their claim is a recent one, and most probable the result of a mistake; upon the whole from the best information I could obtain the above resurvey will not interfere with the rights of any one (MSCOYs excepted) and 2 or 3 squatters who have set down on the stripe between the two lines supposing it to be vacant, R.
