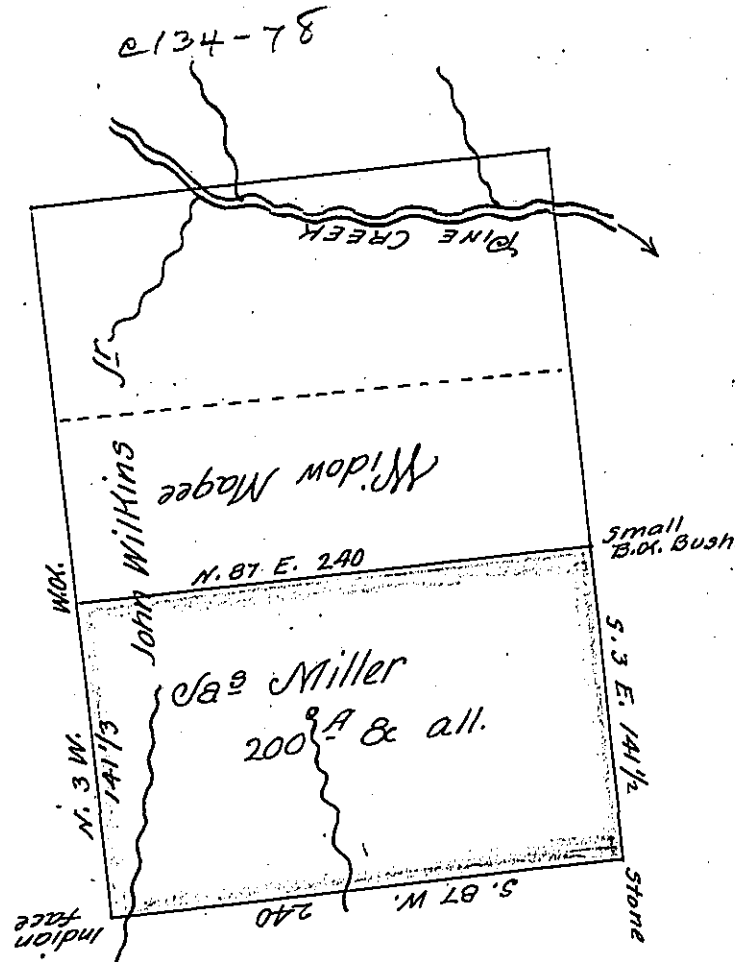


Warrant in the name of Jacob Wolf

A Draught of a survey made by Jonathan Leet Esqr D. S. April 2<sup>d</sup> 1794 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to John Wilkins Jr. for 400 acres dated Feb. 10<sup>th</sup> 1794 called "Indian incanprment Grounds" containing 439 a<sup>2</sup> 25 per<sup>3</sup> & allow<sup>3</sup> & c<sup>cs</sup>

Note: the Southern part of the above tract as shaded with yellow was surveyed by me for James Miller Jan<sup>y</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> 1825 and contains two hundred acres and allowances of six pr<sup>as</sup> for Roads and at the time of surveying the said Miller was residing on the said tract and engaged in improveing the same.
