


Situate in St. Clair township Bedford County containing within the black lines two hundred and twenty four acres, sixty five perches and allowance of six percent for Roads & surveyed the 5th & 6th April 1841 in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 7th January 1794 granted to the said John Sleek Jun^r for 125 acres &c.

N.B. The dotted lines show an interference with a Survey made on Warrant dated 15th January 1828 granted to Samuel Sloan but said not ~~to be~~ returned.

The Slu-----red lines represent a Survey made at the same time of the above for Paul Sleek on Warrant dated the 28th January 1841 granted to the said Paul Sleek for 70 acres. Which includes about 30 acres of cleared land (some of it cleared at least 30 years ago) the Barn & Orchard Which the said John Sleek has now and always had in his peaceable possession. Says he has built the Barn and cleared the fields and that he intends to hold the same until dispossessed by due course of law.

The said John Sleek called upon me on the 6th November 1840 and requested immediate execution of his Warrant tendered me the fees & previous engagements and the early setting in of the Winter prevented me from attending to it until the 5th of April last.
