



A draught of a tract of Land surveyed the 20<sup>th</sup> day of July 1786 in Pursu-  
 ance of a Warrant granted to Daniel Winget dated February the 20<sup>th</sup> 1786 Sit-  
 uate in Morris Township Washington County on the waters of ten mile Creek  
 called Wingets Disaster containing 262 Acres & 124 perches &c.

By virtue of a Warrant granted to Daniel Winget dated February the  
 20<sup>th</sup> 1786 the above described tract of land containing two hundred sixty two  
 acres & one hundred and forty four Perches with the usual allowance of six p<sup>t</sup>  
 Cent for Roads Situate on the Waters of ten mile Creek in Morris Township  
 Washington County was surveyed on the 20<sup>th</sup> day July 1786 by John Hoge Esq<sup>r</sup>  
 Late Deputy Surveyor and Examined and Certified to be correct this 7<sup>th</sup> day  
 of January 1803
