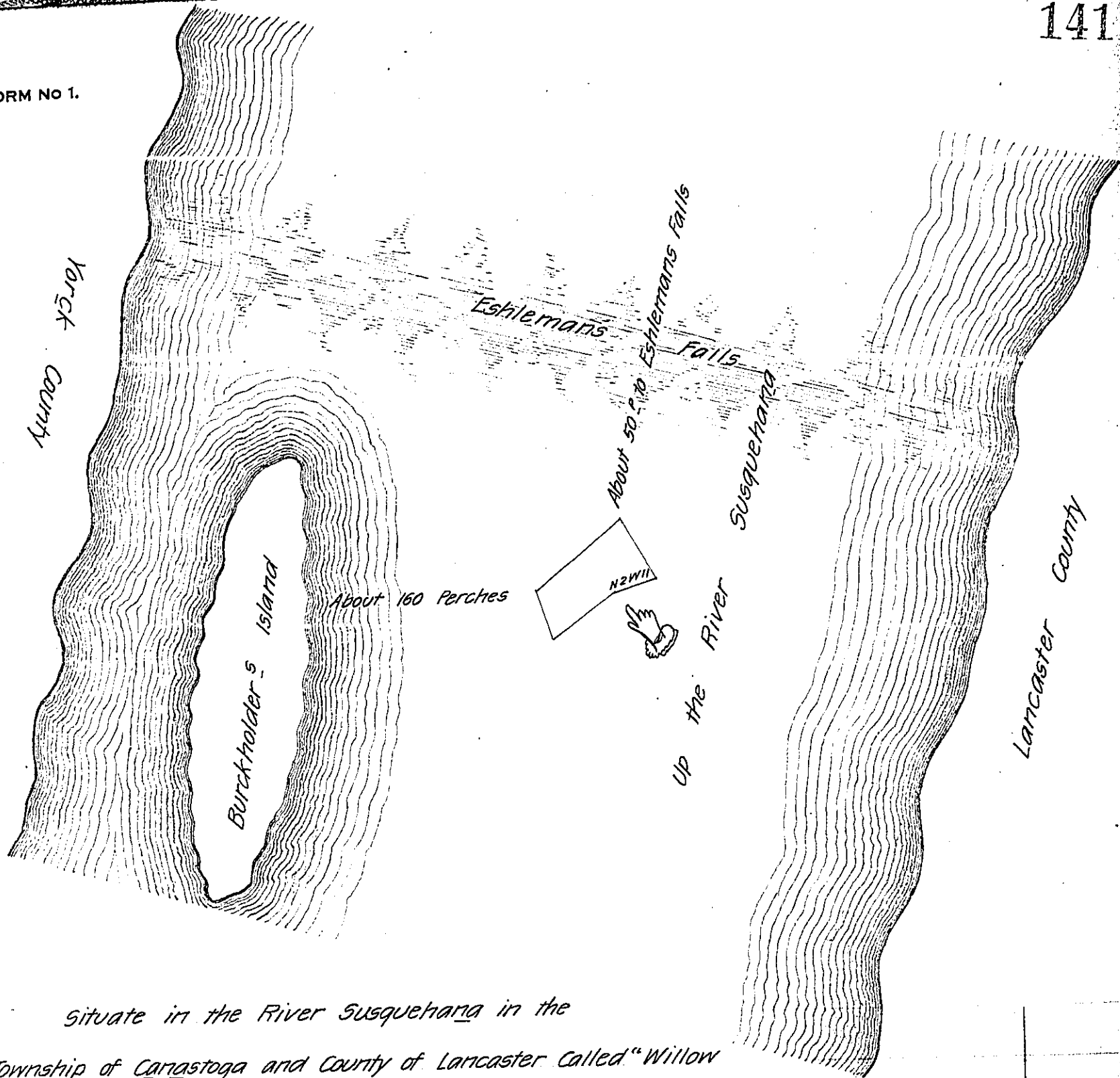


FORM NO 1.



Situate in the River Susquehanna in the Township of Canastota and County of Lancaster Called "Willow Island" Surveyed in Pursuance of a Warrent dated the Ninth day of November 1803 granted to Abraham Werfell of said Canastota Township being bounded and described as follows. Beginning where this ^{MA} mark is Placed in the above Diagram thence extending up said River North two degrees West Eleven perches South Seventy two degrees West Seventeen Perches & Seven tenth-thence down s^d River South twenty eight degrees and a half East twenty eight perches North eighty seven degrees East eleven perches and nine tenth- & thence up s^d River North twenty four degrees west twenty Perches to the Place of Beginning Containing two acres & thirty perches of Land & allowance of six p^{ct} being about a half a mile above Burckholders Island about fifty perches below Eshlemans Falls and about fifty perches to the Eastward of Sterners Island Nov^r 16th 1803
