



Draft of a tract of land containing 231 1/2 Acres and allowance of Six per cent for roads &c. Situate on the waters of Indian Creek in Saltlick township Fayette County. Surveyed the 26 day of October A.D. 1871, in pursuance of a warrant granted to David A. Witt for 200 Acres, dated the 16 day of September, A.D. 1871.

There is about 150 Acres cleared on the above tract; two log houses & a log barn erected thereon.

After making this survey and returning to my office, upon an examination of the records, I find that this tract has been surveyed in Feb. 1841, in pursuance of a warrant granted to Godfrey Willey dated the 4 day of Feb. A.D. 1794, and entered on the records by James Snyder, a former C.S. a copy of which I send herewith. It will be seen that this survey does not include as much land as the former as represented by the dotted lines, the part included in dotted lines is not claimed by David A. Witt and is in possession of other parties, Jacob Inmel & Snaffer. The department can take such action as they see proper.
