The above is a Draft of a Tract of land situate in Green Township Franklin County Containing Three Hundred and forty acres Six perches and allowance of Six per cent for roads &c Surveyed the 14th of April 1829. In pursuance of a Warrant Granted Henry Hartman for Three Hundred & forty acres bearing date the 25th day of January 1811 Surveyed for Wm Nagle & Elizabeth Hartman two of the heirs of Henry Hartman Decd To Gabl. Hiester Esqr Sur^r. Gen^l. William Hamilton D.S

Note the whole of the above tract has been included in a larger Tract of 414 1/2 acs & all Surveyed the 27th of May 1809 for James Orbison on a Warrant Granted to Wm Bailey Jun^r dated the 15th of February 1793 and is Claimed part by Joseph Stall part by Saml. Renfrew & part by Alexander Gray under the title founded on the Warrant to Baily above mentioned

It has been stated by a certain William Hosack that to his certain knowledge the first improvement on the above tract marked thus Δ was commenced in the Summer or fall of the year 1789 & that Henry Hartman the Warrantee Was living in Said improvement in the Spring of 1790 Which Statement is admitted by the claimants under Hartmans Warrant above named G.H.S.G W.H. D.S
