



The above is a draught of a tract of land called Bergen, in the township of Bethlehem in the county of Washington surveyed January 21<sup>st</sup> 1815 in pursuance of a warrant granted to Henry Zimmerman dated December 9<sup>th</sup> 1813 containing twenty Acres and one hundred and seven perches, with the usual allowance of six per cent —

P. S. This survey was executed under <sup>Mr</sup> ~~A~~ Hawkens' directions. He gave me the warrant, together with the field mark merely, on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of June last, and requested me to make the return to the Land Office — I have made enquiry and have understood that <sup>there</sup> are no interfering claims whatever. There was a resident settlement on the land at the time of survey.
