


FORM NO. 1.



The above is a draught of a tract of land called Bergen, in the township of Bethlehem in the county of Washington. Surveyed January 21st 1815 in pursuance of a warrant granted to Henry Zimmerman dated December 9th 1813 Containing twenty Acres and one hundred and seven perches, with the usual allowance of six per cent.—

There was a resident settlement on the land at the time of survey.
