


FORM NO. 1.



Situate on waters of Higgins Creek in Quemahoning Township, Somerset County including his Improvement begun the 1<sup>st</sup> day of May 1799. Whereon was a continued residence of a family of persons from that time to the present time of making the Survey. Grain had been raised &c. fully agreeably to the 50/ Law (yet the Warrant is at \$10- per hundred Acres perhaps through informality of his application, he is intitled to the 50/ Law) And surveyed the 26<sup>th</sup> day of August 1814 in pursuance of a warrant dated the 30<sup>th</sup> day of June 1814.
