S., on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of June A. D. 1766 In Pursuance of a Warrant for 1000 granted to Adam Lohman bearing date the 7<sup>th</sup> day of August A. D. 1765. And the part *B* within the yellow lines Containing as above set forth 112 & 130 ps. and allowance being part of a larger tract of 2250 & 90 Perches and allowance of Land which was originally surveyed by W<sup>m</sup> Matthews late D. S. on the 24<sup>th</sup> of the 3<sup>rd</sup> month 1765 In Pursuance of a Warrant for 1000 Granted to Paul Traub bearing date the 23<sup>rd</sup> of November 1764. And now Resurveyed and divided off from the said Larger tracts of Land on the 24<sup>th</sup> of July 1811, For and at the request of Samuel Shaffer the present owner, who desired the same to be returned for confirmation.
