In pursuance of a Warrant in the Names of Bathshebee Jones and Oliver E. Jones for 13<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub><sup>as</sup> of land dated the 9<sup>th</sup> day of December 1835.

This day Joseph Victor requested a caveat to be entered against the Acceptance of a Survey Returned by me 28<sup>th</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup> 1835 on a Warrant in the Names of Bathshebee Jones and Oliver E. Jones dated 9<sup>th</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup> 1835. 13 acres & all. Said Victor says the land is his own land. I cannot state anything of his right to the same.
