



By Virtue of a genl<sup>l</sup> Warrt<sup>t</sup> from the P<sup>r</sup>riators Comissioners  
 to me directed dated the 20th of the 3d month 1703. I resurvey'd  
 to Daniel Williamson a certain tract of land in Marple in Chester  
 County. Begining at a post in the Great Road being a corner of Jos-  
 eph Powel's land thence north 55 degrees easterly in ye said Powel's  
 Line 350 perches to a black oak thence north 49 deg east by the same  
 land 136 perches to a maple by Darby Creek thence up the sd Creek  
 north 7. w. 7 prchs north 20 west 21 prches to a post thence S. 55 deg  
 westerly by the land belonging to Josiah Taylor's heirs 475 prches to  
 a post thence by the Great Road S. 13. E. 43 pr to the place of Begining  
 Containing one hundred & ten acres. Survey'd the 1th day of the  
 7th month 1708. Pr
