


FORM NO. 1.



By Virtue of a warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing Date the 27th. Day of September anno Do: 1737. I have Surveyd and laid out unto John Edwards in the Township of Vincent in the County of Chester one hundred Acres of Land with all allowance of six $\frac{1}{2}$ cent.

Beginning at a Chestnutt ^{wth} stands in the Line commonly called Coxes Line or Major Thence north West one hundred and six $\frac{1}{2}$ acres to a Hickory Thence North East one hundred and sixty $\frac{1}{2}$ acres to a Chestnutt-oak Thence South East one hundred and six $\frac{1}{2}$ acres to a Post in the sd. Line Thence by the sd. Line South & west one hundred and sixty $\frac{1}{2}$ acres to the place of Beginning.
