Dated ye 4th : 117: 1739 Upon which at ye Request of Se James I measured all ye lines necessary & found his Land to Contain 630 as Exclusive of that Claimed by Abell Griffith which I suppose to be James complement or more of which Return are made toye Serves Office & afterward Abel obtaind his Patent but About a Year ago Se James Sued A. Griffith for a Tresspass which Suit is now to be tryed next Court. The Sherriff& Six men to be on ye Jury Came to ye spott last seventh Day and two Surveyors (to Shew the Lines of ye Land in Dispute) of whom I was one we upon searching found old Marks (viz. old Notch ed trees on ye same Course of the Old about 5 p. Southerly of the Place that Benjamin Run for the Said Griffth, which I am fully of Opinion was made for the Northern Bounds of the Land now in the Tenure of Sel James. I am in Some doubt that Some of ye Jury Incline to favour Thos James for one of the Desired Griffith to make it up with James to Quit Claim to ye Land if James would pay the Law Charges I had an Expectation that ye
