

Pursuant to a warrant from the Commiss of Property dated the 2d of 7 those 1728 There was Survey'd to Michael Jobson A Certain piece or Jecel of Land Situate in Willis-Town in the County of Chester.

Begining at a Chestnut Tree at a corner of Owen Thomas's Land thence South South East by the Land late of Thomas Richard one Hund & forty three igches to a Black Oak thence west South west by the land late of John Bound One. Hundred forty eight igches to a Black Oak thence North North West by Vacant land one Hundred & forty three igches to a post thence East North East by the Land of William Paschall & Isaac Malin one Hundred forty eight igches to the place of Begining Containing one Hundred & twenty five acres & the allowance of Seven acres for Roads & Difference of Surveys
