*Report. The above Tract (except the figure A) is included within the lines of a larger Tract of 76 Acres 91 perches Survey'd 20 August 1791 on Warrant to Alexander, John, James, & Robert Potts dated 17 Sept. 1784 & held under said title. Note the dotted figure marked A is taken into the present Survey as the claimants under the last mentioned Warrant; has recovered the same from Hugh M<sup>c</sup>Curdy the adverse claimant by the Verdict of a Jury The same being given up by M<sup>c</sup>Curdy. W. S. D. Note the dotted figure B. represents the balance of Survey or the Warrant of 1784 Owners & occupiers Alexander Potts, Jacob Sharer & Jacob Brinley*
