



Patent iss<sup>d</sup> to Philip Kesler Assignee of W<sup>m</sup> Gray Sergeant  
8<sup>th</sup> of December 1794

In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of  
the State of Pennsylvania, passed the twenty fourth Day of  
February, one thousand seven hundred and eighty five, entitled an  
Act "for directing the Mode of distributing the Donation Lands,  
promised to the Troops by this Commonwealth," and by Order of the  
Surveyor General, with the Approbation of the Honorable the Exec-  
utive Council, I have surveyed on the 25<sup>th</sup> Day of October one  
thousand seven hundred and eighty five, the above discribed  
Tract of Two hundred and fifty Acres of Land, and Allowance for  
Roads, &c. N<sup>o</sup> 51. situate in District N<sup>o</sup> 111, on the West Side of the  
Alleghany River, in the County of Westmoreland.
