



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly  
of the state of Pennsylvania passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785  
entitled an Act for directing the Mode of distributing the Donation  
Lands promised the Troops of this Commonwealth, and by Order  
of the Surveyor General with the approbation of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the  
Executive Council: I have Surveyed on the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of October 1785  
The above discribed Tract of two Hundred Acres of Land & allowance  
of Six Pcent for Roads & N° MLXIII. Situate in District N° 5 on the  
West side of the Allegany River in the County of Westmoreland.
