



In pursuance of an act of Genr<sup>t</sup> Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania passed the 24<sup>th</sup> Day of February 1785 entitled "an act for directing the mode of distributing the Donation Lands promised the Troop of this Commonwealth" and by order of the Surveyor Genr<sup>t</sup> with the approbation of the Honb<sup>r</sup> Executive Council, I have Surveyd on the 9<sup>th</sup> Day of Novemb<sup>r</sup> 1785 the above described Tract of two hundred acres and allowance of six P.C<sup>r</sup> for Roads &c. N° 1089 situate in District N° 6 on the West side of Allegany River in the County of Westmoreland.
