

In Pursuance of an Act of Gen<sup>t</sup>l Assembly of  
 the State of Pennsylvania passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of Feb<sup>r</sup>. 1785.  
 entitled "an Act for directing the Mode of Distributing the  
 "Donation Lands promised the Troops of this Commonwealth"  
 and by order of the Surveyor General with the approbation  
 of the Hon<sup>t</sup> the Executive Council, I have survy'd on the 1<sup>st</sup>  
 day of August 1785, the above described Tract of two Hundred  
 acres of Land & Allow<sup>e</sup> of six Pct for roads &c. N<sup>o</sup> DCXCV.  
 situate in District N<sup>o</sup> 4 on the west side of the Allegany  
 River in the County of Westmoreland.
