



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania passed the 24th day of February 1785 entitled "an Act for directing the mode of distributing the donation-lands Promised the Troops of this Commonwealth and by Order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of the Hon^{ble} the Supreme Executive Council I have surveyed on the 8th day of November 1785 The above discribed Tract of Five Hundred acres of land and allowance of six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent for Roads & for No. XIV. situate in district No. 1 on the west side of the Allegany River in the County of Westmoreland.
