



In Pursuance of an act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785 entitled "an Act for directing the mode of distributing the donation lands promised the Troops of this Commonwealth, and by order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of the Honorable the Supreme Executive Council I have surveyed on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of November 1785. The above described Tract of Two Hundred & Fifty acres of Land and allowance of six <sup>1</sup>/<sub>100</sub> Cent. for Roads &c. No. XVII. situate in District No. 1. on the west side of the Allegany River in Westmoreland County.
