



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate in the Township of Whiteland in the County of Chester Originally Survey'd to James Thomas (who sold the same to Joseph Coleman & John Sharpless) By Virtue of a Warrant from the late Proprietarys Commissioners. Beginning at a Stone being a corner of Edward Kennison's Land thence south South East by the Land of the sd Kennison four Hundred & Ninety eight fches to a Stone thence East North East by Vacant land one hundred fifty Six fches to a post thence North North West by the Land of William Paschall four hundred Ninty eight fches to a post thence west South West by the Land of Joseph Coleman One Hundred fifty Six fches to the place of Beginning containing Four Hundred Eighty five Acres.

Resurvey'd the 27<sup>th</sup> of Augt, 1725.
