



A Draught of a tract of land called — Situate in Centre township Union County (formerly Penns township Northumberland County) containing Two hundred and ninety three acres and One hundred and forty three perches and the usual Allowance of Six per cent. for roads &c. In pursuance of a warrant for Two hundred and Seventy Acres dated the 26<sup>th</sup>. day of December A.D. 1816 granted to Simon Snyder Esquire for the Extention of a Warrant of One hundred and fifty Acres dated the 20<sup>th</sup> day of May A.D. 1785 granted Philip Van Neida I have resurveyed the sixth day of January A.D. One thousand eight hundred and eight<sup>een</sup>, agreeably to old lines Actually Measured and Surveyed upon the ground in pursuance of the said last mentioned Warrant by Joseph J. Wallis then Deputy Surveyor on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of September A.D. 1785 as appears by the marks and corners yet remaining and agreeably also to the field Notes and Draught in my Office having rejected so much of the land as was previously to said Survey appropriated by Actual Measurement and Survey to Frederick Ublin on his Warrant bearing date the 25<sup>th</sup> day of February A.D. 1793 as appears by the dotted line to Maple on the said line which was formerly part of the above Survey.
