



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries Dated the Twenty Seventh day of Feb^y. 1733 Surveyed unto Jacob Emmin a tract of Land Situate in Oley in the County of Philad^a. Begining at a post in the line of John Browns land thence by the same North Seventy Degrees East Sixty four perches and by Vacant Land the same Course nine perches to a Corner Stone thence by Vacant Land North twenty Degrees west one hundred and Ten perches to a Black Oak Sapling thence by Vacant Land South twenty Degrees East one hundred and ten perches to the place of Begining Containing one hundred acres with the usual Allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent.
