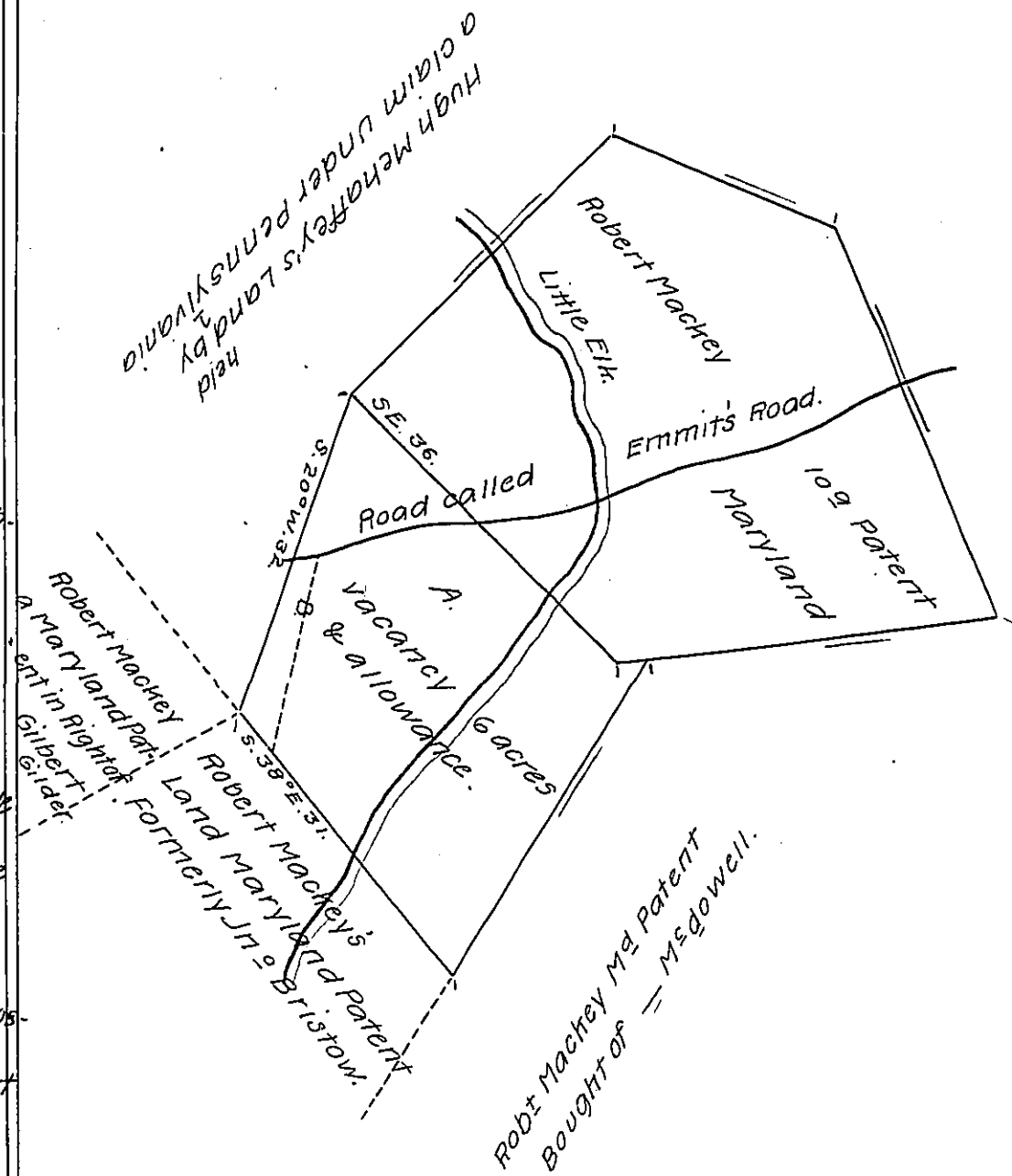


A, the Vacancy Surveyed by the General Surveyors orders, dated the 11th of February last past.
