John Wells asserts

That about the time that James Gibbons's Land on the West branch of Brandywine in Sadsbury was surveyed w<sup>ch</sup> was done by Isaac Taylor on the 18<sup>th</sup> of April 1718 as by s<sup>d</sup> Gibbons's Return appears the s<sup>d</sup> Isaac proceeded (having Ezek. Harlan & Jn<sup>o</sup> Mendinhal for Chain men) to layout 500<sup>as</sup> adjoining to s<sup>d</sup> Gibbons for Isaac Self and run some Lines and marked but finding the Land stony they left it without closing the survey (and it appears that the s<sup>d</sup> self's Land was afterwards laid out in another place) <sup>viz. ye 15<sup>th</sup> of 10<sup>ber</sup> 1719 in Caln</sup> since w<sup>ch</sup> time there was never any survey made thereon till the 14<sup>th</sup> of 7<sup>ber</sup> last on w<sup>ch</sup> day John Taylor surveyed the Land part thereof to himself and part to Thomas Green inclosing therein his <sup>J.Ws.</sup> Improvements. N.B. s<sup>d</sup> Green had no Warrant till September the 20<sup>th</sup> last — And s<sup>d</sup> Wells Consents & allows that if Jn<sup>o</sup> Taylor can prove that he ever made any survey on the s<sup>d</sup> Land for himself before 7<sup>ber</sup> last then he will contentedly resign his Claim to the Land so proved to be surveyed to the s<sup>d</sup> Jn<sup>o</sup> Taylor Jn<sup>o</sup> Wells's Warr<sup>t</sup> for 600<sup>o</sup> dated the 9<sup>th</sup> of Jany. 1733.
