



The above draft represents two adjoining and interfering tracts of land situate in now Walker and Delaware townships formerly Formanagh in the county of Juniata the black lines represent a tract surveyed on a warrant to Thomas Leonard dated 20<sup>th</sup> day of Dec. 1813 & Resurveyed on an order of Resurvey dated June 8<sup>th</sup> 1852, granted to Elijah Leonard and contains 383 acres & .08 perches with the allowance of six per cent, including 150<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> acres, Surveyed on a warrant to John Smith dated July 29<sup>th</sup> 1814 which tract interferes with and overlaps the said Leonard tract as above represented and for which John Smith tract the State has been paid in full of purchase money and patent fees, leaving the Thomas Leonard tract to contain after deducting the part included in the John Smith survey 232<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> acres with allowance.

Examined the above February 12<sup>th</sup> 1873 and found correct.
