Note - It appears that the above was surveyed by David Hough D.S. of Mifflin County, some time about the year 1844 or 1845, in pursuance of a warrant to James Alexander dated May 20th 1844. <sup>A copy of</sup> The warrant remains in the office but no draught, or field notes of Mr. Hough's survey has been found:-

Note - About the time we were ready to begin the above survey, James Alexander appeared on the ground and gave notice that he owned the land and had the Commonwealths receipt for it &c:- He cautioned all claimants and forbid any survey or trespass on the land, as he would defend his rights to the full extent of the Law.
