



In pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of the state of Pennsylvania, passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1785, entitled, "An Act for directing the mode of distributing the donation lands," promised the troops by this Commonwealth; and by order of the Surveyor General, with the approbation of the honorable the Executive Council, I have surveyed, on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1786, the above described tract of two hundred & fifty acres of land, and allowance for roads, &c. No 189, situate in district No 2, on the west side of the Alleghany river, in the county of Westmoreland.
