



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania Passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785 entitled, "An Act for directing the mode of distributing the donation Lands promised to the troops of this Commonwealth" and By Order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Supreme Executive Council, I have survey<sup>d</sup> on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of October 1785, the above discribed Tract of Two Hundred Acres of land and allowance of six  $\frac{1}{2}$  Cent. for Roads &c. No XXII, Situate in district No 1, on the west side of the Allegany river, in the County of Westmoreland.
