



A draught of a tract of land situate in the Long Swamp Township in the County of Berks and Province of Pennsylvania containing three acres and forty Perches of Land together with the usual allowance at six per cent for roads that was surveyed for Jacob Finkbonner by virtue of an Order from the Surveyor General granted to him upon an Application made by the said Jacob Finkbonner for the same dated on the 20th January 1767 No 2285.

Surveyed by order of James Scull Deputy Surveyor for Berks. The said Jacob Finkbonner afterwards sold and conveyed his Right to the same to Ludwig Pitting who now again hath sold the same to Henry Bortz - to whom it was now resurveyed on the 21st March Anno 1778
