The red dotted lines represent part of a survey made for Robert Dean on Warrant dated the 2nd day of September 1784. - This tract interferes one hundred and thirty acres and seventy two perches and allowance with the Thomas Jackson Survey - Robert Dean conveyed to John Cannon from whom the same was sold by the Sherriff to John Scott and Mr. Tussey - John Scott is the present owner of his part - Mr. Tussey conveyed his part to John Stewart the present owner. -
